Somerset House invites visitors to step inside the magical world of **This Bright Land**, a new cultural celebration in the heart of the capital, championing the spirit and strength of community.

Created by Somerset House Studios artists **Gareth Pugh** and **Carson McColl**, in collaboration with Somerset House, *This Bright Land* will transform Somerset House's magnificent open-air courtyard into a welcoming wonderland, open to all, with joyful day-and-night programming featuring performances, music, dance, talks, workshops and more, platforming both established creatives and grassroots communities. Alongside the daily programme, *This Bright Land* will feature bold and unexpected installations and interactive experiences to enjoy. From a sensory journey through the **Wonder Garden created in partnership with Jo Malone London**, complete with curated spaces dedicated to wellness and self-care, to complimentary make-up services in the futuristic custom-built **Clubhouse in partnership with M-A-C Cosmetics**, and a ride on a **35m Observation Wheel** offering breathtaking views of London's skyline, featuring a **new soundscape installation** telling stories from Londoners from all walks of life – there is something

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The festival will put togetherness at its heart, using elements of entertainment and play to encourage connections and collaboration between communities. This Bright Land builds upon Somerset House's foundation as a central hub for creativity and conversation, creating a new vibrant space for discovery and delight throughout the month of August.

- Weekly family-friendly activities for all ages to enjoy from rollicking Street Parties every Sunday hosted by Drag Syndrome, Tomorrow's Warriors, Figs in Wigs and Patrick Ziza, to treasure hunts and social play
- Delicious street food curated by Black Eats LDN, championing culinary delights from Black- owned businesses across London, to be enjoyed alongside bright and zesty cocktails from the Bombay Sapphire bar
- **Innovative designed spaces** for people to enjoy and come together, including a custom-built tiered chillout seating overlooking This Bright Land, perfect for catching a performance in the evenings, or family picnics throughout the day
- Pop-up experiential zone powered by Forest Essentials, Clinique, Bobbi Brown, **Dr.Jart+**, **Aveda** and **Origins** drawing inspiration from different corners of the globe, featuring immersive installations and complimentary light treatments

Friday Night Parties - Music and performance from community collectives

Leading art collectives and creative initiatives take centre stage in Somerset House's magnificent courtyard every Friday of the month, hosting curated nights of performance, sound and festivity celebrating cultures and communities from across the capital. The first Friday night party on 5 August opens with Nine Nights, a creative initiative for developing and platforming Black creative talent, presenting a combination of live and DJ performances from

BRBKO, Chamber 45, Gaika + GLOR1A and Sandra Omari. On 12 August, much-loved Latinx club night hosts Movimientos takes over, with back-to-back sets from the fore fronters of the freshest Latinx party scene in London including DJs Bushbby (Candela Viva) and Ivicore (Popola), Colombian selector Amancai, live percussion and vocals from Witchas, MC and rapper Fedzilla and dance from Somos Chibchas. ESEA Sisters, a platform creating space for women, trans*, non-binary and genderqueer people of East and Southeast Asian heritage, join the line-up on 19 August with a night of performance, art and music from DJs Oh Annie Oh, Shyko, Enxi, Rahel, Lila Yin, Mui Zyu, Nicole Chui and Melissa Kitty. For the final party on 26 August, art collective Daytimers present an evening of music and dance spotlighting the South Asian underground scene, showcasing and celebrating artistry from within the community with DJs Esk, DJ Mimi and Jonny Khan.

Saturday Night Open-Air Vogue Balls

Headlining the festival's Saturday nights is London's weekly Voguing night, **Vogue Rites**. Bringing Ballroom culture to *This Bright Land*, each Saturday will take on a different theme as performers and house members compete for trophies and unique prizes in an outdoor extravaganza of dance, fashion and music, supported by M·A·C Cosmetics. Featuring some of the most exciting names in the international Ballroom scene, themes for the weekly Balls include: **The Heatwave**, a sizzling celebration of summertime with **MC Icon Snookie Juicy** (6 August); **Seeing Red**, showcasing the Ballroom community's combined legacy of artistic excellence and political activism with Holland-based **MC Typhoon Prodigy** and New York's Ballroom **Icon Ashley Icon** (13 August); and **Butterfly**, featuring looks inspired by the symbol for transformation, hope, rebirth and resurrection with New York's Legendary **MC Kevin Jz Prodigy** (20 August). The weekly events will culminate in a **Finale Queer Icons: Tribute Ball** on **27 August** in what is set to be the **largest open-air Vogue Ball in UK history**.

Sunday Street Parties

A series of **guest-curated dazzling street parties** open to all ages will close the weekends every Sunday. Featuring live art, performance, dance, DJs, games, workshops and relaxed inconversation events, these day-to-night parties will platform creative collectives, performance groups and artists exploring ideas relating to race, gender, sexuality and disability.

On **Sunday 7 August**, ground-breaking, internationally acclaimed drag collective **Drag Syndrome** takeover the courtyard for our first Street Party with a spectacular show from highly addictive drag Queens and Kings with Down Syndrome. Join **Nikita Gold, Lady Mercury, Justin Bond, Lady Francesca, Horrora Shebang** and **Davina Starr** for an unmissable party celebrating neurodivergent culture with performances, inspiring talks, tarot card readings and all-round jollity. Special guests include **Sarah Gordy MBE, Sharon Le Grand, Alex Box, Miss Sugar Cube** and **Indoor Goblin**, with DJ sets from **Chloe Frieda (NTS)**.

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On **14 August**, acclaimed talent development organisation **Tomorrow's Warriors** present the next generation of hot talent coming through London's vibrant jazz scene at *This Bright Land*.

For 30 years, *Tomorrow's Warriors* have built an incredible reputation as a leading development organisation for young jazz talent and creative producers of an exciting year round programme of concerts and tours, helping to enable a musical movement that is now recognised on the global stage.

Visitors will be able to enjoy performances popping up throughout the day until the evening from an array of entertainment, including the **Steppin' Over calypso tea dance** featuring **Alexander D Great**, plus UK jazz luminaries including **Gary Crosby, Mark Kavuma, Denys Baptiste, Camilla George, Dian Gasper**, plus the **Tomorrow's Warriors Street Jam Band led by XVNGO**.

Figs in Wigs, aficionados of deadpan dancing and pointless party games, join the line-up on **21 August**. Bringing their own mix of theatre, live art, interactive dance, comedy, DJ sets and games (complete prizes and tiebreakers), this day-to-night party for the whole family will include weird and wonderful activities, including line dancing masterclasses, pea eating world record attempts, and a showstopper finale fashion show of Figs in Wigs' wildest costumes throughout the years.

For the final party of the month on **28 August**, Newcastle-based choreographer **Patrick Ziza** evokes the style of Congolese Sapeurs - outrageously well-dressed men and women, often defying their circumstances in dandyish fashions, sharp suits, hats and canes - in what is set to be a riot of colour, dance, fashion and performance. Visitors will be invited to move, dance and have fun with workshops on how to become a dandy in a day, including accessory and beauty makeovers and tips on how to pose, walk and boogie, to interactive dance performances and talks exploring the history of African Fashion hosted by **Fiona Uwamahoro**.

Engaging talks every Wednesday evening at This Bright Land

Change-makers and community collectives share critical thoughts on representation, connection and disrupting the status quo at *This Bright Land*. On **Wednesday 3 August**, visitors are invited to join a live recording of **Oh Annie Oh's** hit podcast **Don't Call Me "Exotic".** Host Annie will be joined by **Jason Kwan** and **Lilly Snatchdragon** from the UK's only Pan-Asian Cabaret collective **The Bitten Peach**, discussing how and why they formed, and the importance of community.

On 17 August, host Oh Annie Oh returns to *This Bright Land* for a second live recording of her **Don't Call Me "Exotic"** podcast, this time with **Pxssy Palace**, an arts platform rooted in intentional nightlife, providing space to dance, connect and engage, whilst encouraging consent, sexual freedom, pleasure, expression and exploration of our authentic selves.

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Annie will speak to **Nadine Noor, Mya Mehmi & Ryan Lovell** about the need to create these spaces, why it's important to uplift underrepresented communities and how they're able to do all of this by throwing the best parties in London. On **10 & 24 August, The Yard**, a space for young diverse professionals, creatives, and founders to connect, collaborate and flourish join the evening talks line-up, exploring space-makers and space-takers.

An Observation Wheel offering new perspectives on the city, with a soundscape sharing the stories of Londoners

At the centre of *This Bright Land*, a spectacular **35m Observation Wheel** offers new perspectives on the city, both literally and figuratively. The wheel will rise over Somerset House's iconic dome to reveal breath-taking, rare views of the capital's skyline from a new central London viewpoint. Each gondola of the wheel will be home to two new audio commissions, which captures the voices and stories of Londoners from all walks of life. As part of this, Somerset House has worked with seven young people and Audio Producer **Harry Murdoch**, to record conversations and interviews on the theme of family in **Voices of Tomorrow**, supported by the Kusuma Trust. The second audio commission, **A Story of Us** by British-Iranian film director **Mina Salimi**, sees uncanny conversations between Londoners from all walks of life seamlessly woven together in a soundscape exploring connection and commonality.

Stunning sensory experiences for both mind and body from world-leading beauty and wellness brands

For an experience to delight the senses, visitors are invited to step inside the **Wonder Garden created in partnership with Jo Malone London**. This family-friendly, sensory garden will feature floral pathways and unique breakout spaces, offering moments of calm, tranquillity and discovery.

Situated opposite the Wonder Garden, visitors will find the Clubhouse in partnership with M·A·C Cosmetics - a futuristic space designed by Automated Architecture (AUAR). The Clubhouse will be home to active beauty stations where visitors can enjoy free make-up services, with the chance to learn the tips and tricks of the trade from professional make-up artists.

As the summer sun sets, the *Clubhouse* becomes the perfect spot to settle in, grab a drink and watch the evening's entertainment unfold.

Visitors are invited to continue their sensory journey with a series of pop-ups **from leading prestige beauty brands Forest Essentials, Clinique, Dr.Jart +, Bobbi Brown, Aveda** and **Origins**, drawing inspiration from different corners of the globe. Adjacent to the *Wonder Garden*, India's leading skincare brand **Forest Essentials** present a sensorial relaxation space. Visitors will have the chance to test and try out a curated selection of products with Ayurvedic beauty experts on hand for personalised recommendations.

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Across the courtyard, those looking to sit back and soak up the summer rays can do so in the lush oasis of the **Clinique** *Moisture Surge* Aloe Garden where they can enjoy shots of delicious Aloe & Orange and Lemon Ginger Kombucha in sustainable, edible packaging by **Notpla**. Meanwhile, Korean skincare brand **Dr.Jart+** presents a giant human-sized pin art installation inspired by their new launch *Pore Remedy.* Taking inspiration from its NYC roots, **Bobbi Brown** invites visitors to its 'Studio Glow', offering complimentary makeovers and tailored touch-ups. Adjacent to this, **Aveda** will host a green oasis cabaña. Whilst **Origins** presents *GinZing* in an immersive and energising experience.

Outdoor film entertainment with Everyman

Everyman will present 21 days of outdoor film entertainment at This Bright Land, presenting a range of family-friendly screenings, documentaries, and award-winning films. Every weekday at 12.30pm, Everyman brings family favourites to the screen, from Moana to Mary Poppins, with fun and games alongside. On Monday and Tuesday nights, visitors can enjoy musical numbers and documentaries from West Side Story and Bohemian Rhapsody, to 20 Feet From Stardom and Summer of Soul. A special screening of award-winning documentary film, Kiki, which focuses on the challenges of honouring identity and heritage across various art forms, from masquerade, to drag and voguing, will be shown on Thursday 4 August. A talk hosted by Vogue Rites in-conversation with members of the UK Kiki scene will accompany the screening. Visitors to all screenings will receive complimentary popcorn courtesy of Everyman. All daytime screenings are free of charge and visitors can register online to sign-up for free tickets. Pay What You Can tickets are available for evenings Monday to Thursday.

Free daily daytime activities for all ages from garden games to treasure hunts

A rolling programme of free weekday activities will take place throughout the month for visitors of all ages to enjoy, from a site-wide treasure hunt with colourful mascots to guide visitors along the way, to more traditional means of group play, including outdoor games and a story trail. Somerset House's famous fountains will also be dancing up and down for children to splash about in the summer holiday sunshine. Pop-up activations inspiring creativity include the creation of 'scent maps' in the *Wonder Garden* and a fashion customisation hub.
