Somerset House announces **East Wing Edit**, a summer of free activity for all ages including workshops, talks, performances and pop-ups, further exploring the inspirational stories showcased in Somerset House's summer season which celebrates creative pioneers in music, film, independent print and contemporary circus.

Highlights include:

- Stripped back live music sets from up-and-coming musical talent every Friday lunchtime in The Influence Project exhibition, presented by Somerset House residents MOBO and Music For Youth
- Inspiring weekly Tuesday talks from industry insiders including #realmusicrebels co-founder Lalah Hathaway, and the co-founders behind the empowering Girls on Tops start-up who champion female voices in film supported by the likes of Greta Gerwig and Rooney Mara
- Interactive Saturday drop-in sessions offer the chance to work collaboratively with the artists and collectives, from making fanzines with Little White Lies to being part of a real-time data visualisation with Delayed Gratification alongside our major summer exhibition PRINT! Tearing It Up
- Additional events include DJ sets presented by Rye Wax and an exclusive screening of the acclaimed documentary Betty They Say I'm Different, revealing the unknown story of legendary funk pioneer Betty Davis
- Pop-up bar and café from Hej, offering eco-friendlγ products and a comfortable area to sit, read and listen to The Influence Project soundtrack

This summer, Somerset House presents eight weeks of free exhibitions, talks, pop-ups, events and workshops, delving deeper into the stories showcased in Somerset House's season of music, film, independent print and contemporary circus performances with events and exhibitions including PRINT! Tearing It Up, PROCESS!, Somerset House Summer Series, Film4 Summer Screen and Circus Sampler.

#### EAST WING EDIT 27 June – 22 August 2018

Through a series of weekly takeovers from acclaimed creative collectives such as Rye Wax and Little White Lies, **East Wing Edit** celebrates the pioneers who have shaped or are shaping contemporary culture and offers a unique insight into the creative industry and its processes.

Across the season, visitors have the unique chance to meet artists, collectives and organisations who are working collaborativelγ, testing new materials and making work which challenges boundaries, all within the confines of Somerset House's East Wing.

#REALMUSICREBELS | Week 1 | 27 June – 3 July Roots of Resistance: Mapping the Spirit of Jazz, Hip Hop and Reggae 30 June, 11.00 – 14.00, Free In Conversation with #realmusicrebels Co-Founder Lalah Hathaway 3 July, 13.00 – 14.00, Free

Co-founded by Lalah Hathaway, #realmusicrebels, a collective of socially conscious artists, is spearheading the movement for musical integrity and activism. For the duration of their takeover, visitors have the opportunity to explore the intersection of art and activism, through video installations of iconic jazz musicians, listening stations and key reading materials. The takeover will play host to **pop-up** performances from Hathaway and other guests, with in-depth discussions around the power of music for social change.

As part of a series of free weekly Tuesday lunchtime talks, visitors will be given a rare opportunity to hear Lalah Hathaway discuss her art and activism, with an **exclusive screening** and Q&A on her forthcoming short film 'honestly', which features animated appearances from friends & collaborators Terrace Martin and Thundercat. The collective will also host a Saturday drop-in session, mapping the spirit of jazz, hip hop and reggae through an afternoon of live DJ sets.

**Rye Wax**, Peckham's legendary record shop, takes over the East Wing for two weeks. The pop-up offers a space for countercultural movements to flourish, where people can discover new sounds and different ways of interacting with music, from turntable listening stations to live performances.

As well as a varied selection of vinyl, the store offers a broad range of high-quality independent prints representing photography, writing and illustration, and play host to two **label showcases** from **COTCH INTERNATIONAL** and **West Friends**.

During the final week of Film4 Summer Screen, bi-monthly film magazine Little White Lies, which combines cutting-edge design, illustration and journalism, takes up residence for an East Wing Edit takeover, championing great movies and the people who make them.

For their Saturday session, the team descends upon Somerset House to make a **bespoke movie fanzine** inspired by the life and work **of Arnold Schwarzenegger**. Visitors put their cut-and-paste skills to the test to create a miniature magazine which will be handed out at the evening's double-bill screening of **Total Recall** and **A Nightmare on Elm Street**.

The team will also moderate a talk with Louisa and Jake, the co-founders of the empowering Girls on Tops tshirt start-up championing female voices in film, which has garnered host of major Hollywood celebrities as fans including **Greta Gerwig**, **Rooney Mara** and **Timothée Chalamet**.

#### Inspiring contemporary culture

One of the city's most spectacular and well-loved spaces, Somerset House is a new kind of arts centre in the heart of London, designed for today's audiences, artists and creatives – an inspirational community where contemporary culture is imagined, created and experienced.

From its 18th Century origins, Somerset House has played a central role in our society as a place where our culture and collective understanding of the world is shaped and defined. In 2000, it began its reinvention as a cultural powerhouse and home for arts and culture today, creating unique and stimulating experiences for the public, bringing them into direct contact with ideas from the greatest artists, makers and thinkers of our time. Our distinctive and dynamic year-round programme spans the contemporary arts in all its forms, from cutting-edge exhibitions and installations to annual festivals, seasonal events in the courtyard including Film4 Summer Screen, Summer Series and Skate, and an extensive learning and engagement programme.

As well as welcoming over 3 million visitors annually, Somerset House houses the largest and most diverse creative communities in the country – from one-person start-ups to successful creative enterprises including MOBO, British Fashion Council, Dance Umbrella, Improbable Theatre, Hofesh Schecter Company, and Dartmouth Films.

In 2016 we launched Somerset House Studios – a new experimental workspace connecting artists, makers and thinkers with audiences. Currently housing over 80 artists and Makerversity (a community of over 250 emergent makers), the Studios are a platform for the development of new creative projects and collaboration, promoting work that pushes bold ideas, engages with urgent issues and pioneers new technologies. www.somersethouse.org.uk
