Somerset House Studios – Somerset House's experimental workspace for artists, makers and thinkers celebrates its past four years with **AGM 2020**, a special night of **live-streamed premieres**, **collaborations**, **performances**, **and experimental DJ sets** from an expanding community of artists.

Featuring performances broadcast live from Somerset House, as well as remotely from across the UK and beyond, *AGM 2020* **premieres five new commissions** from a specially curated line-up of artists, writers and musicians pushing boundaries within their practice, including **Aida Amoako, DeForrest Brown, Jr., Josiane M.H Pozi, Rian Treanor, Tyreis Holder,** plus a special performance from **Sarra Wild.**

The artists taking part in this year's line-up have been specially selected by a panel of Studios

artists and alumni - **Beatrice Dillon, Jesse Darling, Klein and Larry Achiampong** – who were asked to propose artists who they are most excited by at the moment. All artists have been offered access to space and support from the Studios' artistic community to develop and showcase their new works for AGM. The evening's programme will also highlight works from Somerset House Studios' wider resident community and alumni, including **Anna Mikkola, Malik Nashad Sharpe** and **Sam Williams**.

Home to a unique community of over 300 artists, makers and thinkers since 2016, Somerset House Studios celebrates the importance of generosity and collaboration in a time of increased separation for its 2020 edition of AGM, highlighting the value of bringing people together and sharing resources for powerful artistic collaborations.

All works will remain available to view online for one month following their premiere at *AGM* 2020.

LINE-UP HIGHLIGHTS:

Streamed live from his home city of New York, techno artist and theorist **DeForrest Brown, Jr.** (aka Speaker Music) premieres an exclusive AV performance drawing upon the themes explored in his 2020 album *Black Nationalist Sonic Weaponry*, created in response to recent events surrounding the Black Lives Matter movement.

London-based filmmaker and visual artist **Josiane M.H Pozi** showcases a new video work exploring the importance of elevation, friendship, and allyship in collaboration with Somerset House Studios artist alumni **Klein**. Following its premiere at *AGM 2020*, Pozi's work will be available to view as part of the third season of Somerset House Studios' permanent exhibition space, Gallery 31 in 2021.

Rotherham-based artist and producer **Rian Treanor** presents a new collaborative performance, developed through a series of workshops with five Visual Art & Design students from the BRIT school, using specially developed software to create a remote networked performance.

Artist, poet and visual storyteller **Tyreis Holder** shares a new poetry performance as part of the evening's line-up. Placing herself within an installation, Holder's performance centres around ideas of self, identity and lived-in experience. Exploring the position of a young Black woman navigating the everchanging states of 2020, Holder's new work addresses themes of uncertainty, mental health, society, class, culture and issues pertaining to the Black Lives Matter movement.

This online edition of **Amplify** at Somerset House Studios includes a series of digital training sessions and workshops offering participants the opportunity to gain knowledge and skills in presenting their online presence and portfolio, pitching, understanding intellectual property and legal advice for musicians and artists. Workshops include coaching on confidence building, production, online shows and how to use your intuition in uncertain times.

The residency provides an opportunity to share work with Somerset House Studios artists and network within this community of talented professionals, and participants will also engage with performances, discussions, artist presentations, digital installations and films as part of our online public programme.
